


Chairman's note

Confounding colour

News from the Groups

Groups shared by Sevenoaks and Knole U3A In 2009 Knole and Sevenoaks U3As drew up an agreement about shared groups. With the passage of time, and the establishment of two new U3As in the Sevenoaks catchment area, we decided to review the operation of the agreement and assess how the arrangements have worked in practice.

In general we conclude that the agreement has worked well and benefited the members of both organisations. We believe that we should continue to collaborate wherever that is to the mutual benefit of both U3As.

Membership. One of the initial concerns of both U3As was to avoid the situation where members of one U3A blocked places in popular groups in the other U3A. This has not been a problem so far but now one or two of the shared groups are at the point where they may have to establish waiting lists. In these circumstances the principle is that once someone is a member of a shared group they may remain a member for as long as they wish, regardless of their parent U3A, but priority on the waiting list will be given to members of the U3A to which the group belongs.

Leadership. In some cases leadership of a shared group may pass from a member of one U3A to a member of the other U3A. The issue arises of whether ownership of that group should then pass to the parent U3A of the new group organiser. In general we believe that this is what should happen as the new group organiser will be subject to the practices and disciplines of the U3A to which she or he belongs, but cases should be determined on their merits. If this situation occurs a decision on ownership of the group should be taken in consultation with the Group Coordinators, taking account of the wishes of the members of the group in question.

Assets. Where equipment is provided to a group it remains the property of the U3A which provided it. The equipment could be recalled at their discretion and would be returned to them were the group to cease. Where a U3A provides a grant or subsidy to a shared group that U3A would have first call on the financial assets of the group were it to cease to function.

In some cases a shared group may have money or assets which have been provided by the group's own members. Where such a group ceases the assets would be the property of the parent U3A.

Subject to the points above, we believe that the principles which underpinned our original agreement on shared groups remain largely valid and should continue to be the basis on which

arrangements are made for shared groups in the future.

Groups can be advertised to members of the other U3A as shared groups where:

- There is a <u>specialist</u> subject group which cannot attract enough support in one U3A to be viable and there is no parallel group in the other U3A OR
- Meeting the hire cost of a hall or other facilities would be impossible or difficult if the group was not shared.

Group Organisers/Contacts who wish to offer spaces which meet the above criteria should continue to approach either Beryl Mansell (Sevenoaks) or John Stambollouian (Knole) to ensure their group would benefit from advertising within the other U3A. Please do not accept members from another U3A without checking with your Group Coordinator first.

'Sevenoaks U3A is open to members of other U3As unless the other U3A does not permit this.'

If a member of another U3A wishes to join us they are welcome to do so, provided they are permitted to by their other U3A/s. They will pay the membership fee and should be treated as a full member of our U3A. Rules on shared groups will not affect them.

Please ask to see the membership cards of your group members at the start of the 2013/14 year. 
