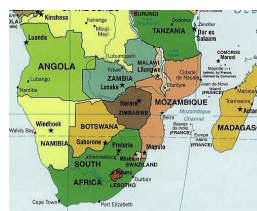

### **Fungus Foray** Rosina Cole

On a fine Autumn morning about a dozen of us assembled in the NT car park at Toys Hill for the first of six fungus Forays organised and led by Trudy Fleming.

First Trudy showed us examples she had previously gathered. A close examination of the structure and smell of fungi is important for their identification. The separation of edible from poisonous species is not always easy!

Following this we spent a very happy couple of hours in the woodland searching out fungi. Once we had our 'eye in' we found these to be numerous and of all different sizes shapes and colours. Fungi are the fruiting bodies sent up by the mycelium, the main part of the fungal organism hidden beneath the surface.

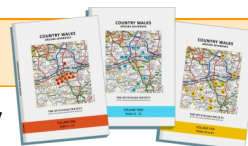
Unfortunately the trip to Leipzig and Dresden for May 17-21 2016 has had to be cancelled due to lack of firm commitment from enough people
