All players are involved in all aspects of the game - batting, bowling and fielding. All players are Batters and are in for 2 full overs. If bowled, caught etc they remain at the wicket but lose runs from the team score. All players are also Bowlers and bowl for 2 overs. Any wickets taken add to their team score. When not bowling they are fielders. Running loses team points. Equipment is light and is similar to youngsters equipment (light air ball, light bat) so no protective clothing is needed.

There is no league to play in as yet but it is good exercise, good company and fun.

AN ADVENTUROUS HEN NIGHT

I received an invitation to join my granddaughter and her friends on her hen night. We would take the train to London, get a boat to Greenwich, then climb the Millenium Dome, followed by a meal out. There were nine of us in the group with ages ranging from 22 to 50, and myself well over 80.

At the dome, shoes and personal belongings were put in a special box. We were given trainers to wear and fitted with a harness, which would be clipped onto a thick wire running all the way up and over the dome. My granddaughter went first, I went next with the other seven members of the group behind. There was a guide going backwards and forwards checking all the harnesses were clipped on securely, and there was a thick wire rope which we used to pull ourselves up. The first few steps were easy, then came the more challenging bit. We hauled ourselves gradually up until we reached the viewing platform on top of the dome. The views over London were fantastic and well worth the climb.

Going down seemed steeper than the climb up. We were advised to go down backwards as it would be less stressful on our knees. Gradually we reached the end, then the cheers and clapping started. When I told the guide how old I was, he said that the oldest person who had previously attempted to climb the dome was 80, but they could not make it and had to be helped down. He said that I was the oldest person who had ever climbed the dome.

After we reached the ground, a photo was taken and we were led into the shop where I was presented with a teddy bear and photo for being the oldest person to climb the dome. My granddaughter contacted me the next day to thank me for making her day so memorable.
