
NOTICE OF ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING 2020

NEWS FROM THE GROUPS

Science News

Our Science Committee are following Government Guidelines regarding Covid-19 and although some of the recent rules are relaxing we recognise that for our members there still remains a risk regarding social gatherings in confined spaces. We will therefore decide nearer the start of our normal season how we run our Science Open meetings. One of our speakers has indicated that they would be prepared to deliver a talk by Video Conferencing if required, and this remains an option for our autumn programme.

Science Discussion Group 1 continues to operate virtually on a 2-weekly basis. We have been busy studying recovery scenarios emerging from the Covid-19 crisis. We can see the resumption of activities will have a major impact on our lifestyles and in particular our shopping habits. One casualty of this will be our High Street retail outlets, where there has been a dramatic shift to on-line shopping, a trend that is unlikely to reduce significantly in the future.

Last September a number of our members from the science groups joined forces with the Robotics Research Team at Kings College London to explore the problem of remote sensing and monitoring of hydration in the elderly, especially for those in care. This Workshop was a precursor to a full scale project where we would have been involved in the data gathering, testing and design of a robotic device. However funding for this project was not forthcoming from the Engineering and Physical Sciences Research Council (EPSRC) and of course the Covid-19 crisis has directed

much of the effort and resources to other projects. However, the initial research activity was completed and publication of the findings and our Workshop is now in preparation and is expected to be published in the Journal of Clinical Nursing. We have permission from Kings College to post this on our website once the report has been finalised as our members are co-authors of the report. Please look out for further updates when this report can be accessed from our Website.

English Concertina Group



I am delighted to report that our little group of six players has expanded from four over the last year or so. We meet every two weeks at The Otford Methodist Hall on Monday mornings by arrangement. We love playing together especially when we play the right notes! We play from sheet music and we now have a repertoire of well over a hundred tunes. We all enjoy our sessions and regard them first and foremost as a fun experience.

Of course like many groups when coronavirus started to spread, we quickly decided to stop our face to face meetings and we now meet using Zoom video conferencing. At these sessions one person leads and the rest follow with their sound muted on Zoom and it works quite well and makes for good practice. We have doubled the frequency of these meetings to weekly which gives us time to play and also to include more social chat than usual.

There are three types of Concertina the Anglo, the Duet and the English, and they all play differently. Way back in 1829 Charles Wheatstone invented the concertina. The other great makers were Crab, Lachenal, Jeffries and McCann. In almost 200 years the instrument and the way it is played has changed little. If you are lucky you may still find yourself a Wheatstone or other make vintage concertina. The restored old ones are still considered the best, but there are many modern instruments on the market although their sound rarely comes up to the quality of the originals.

The concertina is the smallest and most compact instrument of the squeezebox family, it was the type of squeezebox that was favoured by the sea going men in the early 19th century because it was easy to stow away in their small sea chests. You will often see modern folk musicians singing sea shanties and being accompanied by a concertina. It is a lightweight and relatively easy-tohandle instrument and is both versatile for playing tunes, song or dance music accompaniment. The two most popular types are the Anglo and the English and thirdly the Duet which

is the least common and least easy to find or buy in modern times.

The Anglo Concertina produces a DIFFERENT NOTE on the 'push' and on the 'pull'. The English Concertina produces the SAME NOTE on the 'push' and on the 'pull'.

We have performed in public quite a few times to clubs and residential homes but we have had to delay some performances due to the current crisis. At Christmas time we did a couple of performances in local pubs in exchange for a free lunch which was most enjoyable. On other occasions we have played to raise money for charities.

We would be delighted to consider any member who is interested in learning to play the instrument. It would be better if you can already read music and it would also help to have some experience of playing another instrument but these are not necessarily prerequisites. We will be pleased to give advice and guidance to anyone interested whatever their experience.
