SCIENCE GROUP

Monday 9 March

High Power Lasers - Using high powered lasers and plasmas to make compact particle accelerators. Dr Robert J Shalloo

Dr Rob Shalloo is a Research Associate within the John Adams Institute for Accelerator Science working with a group on the development of plasma-based particle accelerators. He predominantly focuses on experimental work, both locally and at national facilities such as the Central Laser Facility. The Central Laser Facility provides a broad spectrum of laser facilities, from high intensity laser systems to ultra-fast sources and laser microscopy techniques. Underpinning the laser facilities are enabling capabilities, from computational plasma physics to target micro-fabrication and engineering. The talk will address the application of High Power Laser technology to future science and engineering activity.

WARNING: WINDOWS 7 – RIP

Microsoft withdrew support for their computer operating system, Windows 7, in January. There is no need to panic, but you should not carry on using Windows 7 indefinitely. Don't be complacent: you may have used the same road every day for the last 10 years, but there's no guarantee that a sinkhole won't appear in it tomorrow! You should consider the need to move off Windows 7 more urgent if you make payments online, or use online banking.

Upgrading from Windows 7 to Windows 10 is not a

trivial exercise, and for older machines may well be impossible. The simplest way to move off Windows 7 is to get a new machine.

Whatever you decide to do, don't contemplate it until you have securely backed up your data, and checked that you can retrieve data from your backup.
