This will be the last newsletter produced by the existing team. Elizabeth Purves. Victoria Granville Baxter and Celia Smith have done a magnificent job for a number of years, but the time has come for other members to take their **HELP** places. NEEDED! We have volunteers, at least in the short term, for

setting out and proofreading, but we still need an editor. That role involves reminding the regular contributors a few days in advance, making sure that all the text is in the same font and size, and then transferring the material onto a single Word document. That document together with photographs is sent to the other members of the team. It is then set out in Microsoft Publisher, and after proofreading it is sent to the printers in Maidstone. There are still 370 members who have their newsletters delivered in printed form. Most members though receive theirs by email, which has the advantage of being in colour and arriving several days earlier.

Government rules regarding meetings seem to be changing almost every day. As at 9th September it seems that meetings of any six people in homes are now permitted – but it may be different next week. That may allow some groups to resume meetings in members' homes. However, meetings of more than six in parks, pubs, clubs and restaurants are no longer permitted. No mention has so far been made of halls, some of which have been allowing meetings of up to 30. If your group would like to meet in a hall you should make contact with the hall management to find out what is permitted. Any costs for hiring a hall have to be met by the group.

We will shortly be sending out a questionnaire. The purpose is to find out what you do in U3A, what improvements you can suggest, ways in which you could use your skills, and ways in which you could offer help. I hope you will be able to find the time to complete the form when it arrives.

SCIENCE OPEN MEETING NEWS

As reported last month we will be starting our Science talks on **Monday 12**th **October at 14:00hrs.** This will be run as a Zoom webinar. In preparation for this our U3A has purchased the Pro-Zoom version that gives much greater flexibility over running such meetings.

Our subject, not as advertised in the Handbook, is:

The manufacture of Ammonium-nitrate based fertiliser products and some major Ammonium nitrate accidents by Rob Weighill.

The talk will describe high profile incidents where ammonium nitrate (AN) has detonated causing widespread devastation, Beirut being the latest in quite a large number. Ammonium nitrate is commonly used in agriculture as a fertilizer and is generally safe if stored and used appropriately. However, it can be energetic and if stored or used improperly it may detonate.

Rob is one of our members and had a 50-year career at Fort Halstead, spending a considerable part of his time researching and analysing AN, and carrying out trials into its misuse. Rob is hoping to relay some information from one of our members who was in Beirut at the time of the recent explosion.


