**By Bus From** Waterloo Station No. 521 (bus stop in Tenison Way) - alight Chancery Lane

tube: **From** Victoria Station No.38 - alight at Red Lion Street;

**From** Charing Cross Station catch a bus to Fleet Street, alight at Fetter Lane and walk through to Chancery Lane (about 10 mins walk).

Please wear comfortable shoes. Tour will last around 1hr 45 mins

**Lunch:** In the area of Hatton Garden there are pubs, restaurants and sandwich bars serving a variety of food.
