

**CHAIRMAN’S COLUMN**

**The Platinum Jubilee**, the first celebrated by a British Monarch, marks the Queen’s 70 years of service. Our u3a contributed to national celebrations on the June 2-5 weekend (see below). Anniversaries mark the date of special events, birthdays, weddings, the first time we met. Sadly the recurring date when a loved one died is a harder one to bear.

**The Summer Solstice** on June 21st, will mark the longest day of the year and the start of summer, which lasts until the Autumn Equinox on September 23<sup>rd</sup> when daylight and night hours are equal. This is remarkably contem-

poraneous with the summer rest most of us take from our labours in the University of the Third Age! Conversely and pre-Covid, the annual Open Day on the 4<sup>th</sup> Wednesday in September would start the “academic year”, while the AGM on the 4<sup>th</sup> Wednesday in the following June would effectively end it.

**Covid has not entirely disappeared**, though you would not know it going to the cinema, travelling on trains and even on the underground. Hardly anyone is wearing masks. However, in the first week in June 54,171 people had positive test results, an increase of 53.2% compared

to the previous week, and there were 4,602 patients in hospital with coronavirus on 13 June, but only 128 required mechanical ventilation. Also long Covid, with persisting symptoms of tiredness and fatigue, is increasingly recognised. The pandemic in the UK appears to be entering an endemic phase. The virus is still contagious, but a combination of vaccination, possible loss of viral virulence, and the availability of treatments, means that most of the population will eventually be infected but the great majority will have a relatively mild illness.

## COMPUTER GROUP OPEN MEETINGS

In 2014-16 the average attendance at Sevenoaks U3A Computer Group Open Meetings, held in the Otford Village Memorial Hall (OVMH), was 39. In 2019-20 (the last pre-Covid year) average attendance was 25. Covid caused us to run these meetings using Zoom; attendance was variable but declined, despite enabling people from further afield (e.g. Westerham, Hawkhurst) to join. The average attendance at the two most recent meetings, one in OVMH, the other on Zoom, was eight.

Attendance at the open meetings has declined to a level which does not cover the cost of hiring the OVMH or warrant the effort that goes into arranging presentations at these meetings. No-one has so far been prepared to take on the Apple Group, following the death of Dave Simmons, and the committee running the Computer Group meetings is too small.
