
MONTHLY MEETING

A talk by Professor Trevor Jones on Infectious Diseases

Professor Jones is a director of the Association of the British Pharmaceutical Industry. From 1987 to 1994 he was a main board director of The Wellcome Foundation with responsibility for research and development of drugs for treating conditions including HIV/AIDS, Epilepsy,

Malaria, Migraine and Hepatitis. He will outline the major global infectious diseases, show how they are transmitted and what is currently available for prevention, treatment and cure.



The Blues Roll On. Jazz and Blues Group 1 Study Afternoon

Four years ago we brought you “Good Morning Blues” an exploration of the country and piano blues with veteran British bluesmen Bob Hall and Dave Peabody.

For “The Blues Roll On” Dave returns in the company of ex Yardbirds harmonica player Alan Glen. They will talk and play us through the migration of the blues from its heartland in the Mississippi Delta to Chicago and beyond where the music with the help of amplification, evolved and flourished. This was captured by such companies as Chess whose records found their way over the pond to UK to kick start a British Blues Scene.

YOUR WEBSITE NEEDS YOU!


The Sevenoaks U3A website is becoming an ever more important part of our learning community. It sets out a huge range of information and is used increasingly by members looking for information and activities, and by non-members looking at what we offer and deciding whether to join. All the most recent recruits have joined us after seeing our website. But the website does not run itself, and our U3A is always in need of members who are interested in helping to run and improve our website. To work with the web team, you would not need to be an IT genius, or necessarily to have website skills. You would just need to be able to:

- learn how to insert and remove items;
- solve the occasional problem;
- respond to queries and issues raised by members;
- work with the other team members on generally improving the site over time.

The web team meets about once a month. The (currently) six members work mainly in pairs between these meetings to prepare updates of the site which are then published every month or so. The software used is Net Objects Fusion (NOF) 2015 and you would be given support while becoming familiar with it. This is a very successful theatre/restaurant in a converted mill, in a rural spot by the River Thames. Eileen and Timothy Richards came across the derelict mill that had stopped milling flour. After years of conversion work, the theatre/restaurant opened in 1982. There is a new show every two months and the package always includes a meal. There are Sunday concerts and an events programme in the newly refurbished and most atmospheric Watermill Bar.

We were blessed with a very sunny winter's day and had a good coach journey for the time of year. A most convivial meal at the Mill was followed by the comedy, 'Stepping Out' by Richard Harris, a funny and heart-warming play that had run for many years in the West End. It seemed just the right choice for a relaxing Christmas 'day out'.
