Aviation Group Visit

The Aviation Group celebrated the end of their very successful first year with a visit in June 2018 to the Gatwick Aviation Museum. Situated just outside the north-west corner of the airport boundary, the museum is on the site of an old battery hen farm purchased by the founder of the museum, Peter Vallance, in 1981. Since then the museum has grown despite many disputes with the local planning authorities and appeals to the Planning Inspectorate. A permanent building replaced old temporary huts in 2010. The museum is run by a charitable trust and combines the museum with an education centre. Being entirely self-supporting, the museum relies heavily on the help of volunteers.

Our Group was looked after by the Museum Manager and two volunteers who took turns to explain the various exhibits. We started with an overview of the development of Gatwick airport since it was licensed for commercial traffic in 1934. Following this we toured the ten classic British jet aircraft dating from the end of World War II to the late 1970s, ranging from a humble trainer to the supersonic Lightning fighter. We were also shown many of the nearly 30 jet engines on display. The final exhibit, which we could enter, was a Shackleton used for Cold War maritime reconnaissance duties, described by a volunteer who had been a pilot on such aircraft. We had expected our tour to last about one hour, but we were there for two and a half hours, and even then had to cut the visit short to avoid being late for our lunch at the nearby Fox Revived. All-in-all an excellent way to end the year!

Science Group Visit to RAF Hendon

On Monday 10th September the Science Committee organised a visit to the RAF Museum at Hendon which this year is celebrating the 100th Anniversary of the RAF. The Hendon site was originally the home of the Grahame-White Aviation Company founded in 1911. The demand for aircraft in WW1 kept the company busy but by 1922 the Air Ministry took over the site. Between the wars Hendon was a major centre for aviation and was owned by the RAF until 1987. Today it is the home of the RAF Museum and with new facilities built this year it can now present the history of the RAF over the past hundred years with exhibits in a total of six hangars.

We met our guide who then enthusiastically took us through the various hangars and with his expert knowledge showed us the development of aircraft from WW1, WW2 and into the Cold War and up to modern times. Aircraft from allied and axis powers were also on display plus the various weapons that they carried.

Following lunch our members used some free time to explore further exhibits. Overall a very enjoyable visit for all concerned.
