## MONTHLY MEETING - APRIL 28TH at 2 p.m.



Our speaker this month is Richard Griffin who will be giving a presentation entitled, “**The Queen’s Police Officer**”.

Richard served in the Metropolitan Police from 1970 to 2013 when he retired with the rank of Superintendent. From 1983 to 1986 he was the Personal Protection Officer (PPO) for Prince Edward and from 1986 to 1999 he was PPO for the Duke of Edinburgh. From 1999 to 2013 he served in the role of PPO to Her Majesty the Queen, a position known as the Queen’s Police Officer. Her Majesty invested him with the honour of LVO, Lieutenant of the Royal Victorian Order, on his retirement.

No further registrations are required as Zoom link invitations will be sent to all current Sevenoaks u3a members, and I do hope you will be able to join us on the day for what promises to be a fascinating talk.

## IMPROVING MUSIC RECEPTION IN ZOOM

Are you having trouble with Zoom audio reception? The Tech team and some EC members have been looking at the quality of transmission of music to Zoom users. Zoom is optimised for voice transmission such that music transmission may not be received in an optimum way.

For our test we linked up with our forthcoming AGM speaker who as a professional harpist, will be transmitting live music using high quality microphones. We therefore wanted to establish the optimum experience for our members. We used a variety of common devices that would represent what our members use from a basic PC or laptop with integral speakers to devices with auxiliary enhancements such as external speakers, headphones or links to TV systems via the HDMI link.

Unsurprisingly, the auxiliary devices enhance reception for the listener but there are also settings within Zoom which can be adjusted to optimise music transmission. Adjusting Zoom audio settings together with the addition of auxiliary devices will help to optimise your experience when listening to Zoom music broadcasts.

### RECORDER GROUP



The Recorder group was set up in 2010 by June Farrel, who initially ran two sub-groups, one of experienced players and one of three beginners, two of whom could neither read music nor play the recorder and are both still members of the group. I was one of the latter and was introduced to the mysteries of musical notation via 'Three Blind Mice', causing many giggles in our house. Eventually the two sub-groups merged and for the past couple of years we have had ten members, including an ex-teacher who can play four of the main types of recorder.

Since March last year, under the leadership of Pat Wells, we have met weekly on Zoom. Despite technological limitations to playing, Zoom has been of enormous benefit in mitigating the isolation of lockdown and has been particularly welcomed by the member who has been marooned in Greece since last summer by travel restrictions. She is missing our group with whom she enjoys the same sense of humour, banter and gossip. Indeed, we can spend more time gossiping than playing! Alerted by June, eight of us joined her recently in enrolling for the national U3A (virtual) Winter School for recorders, the nine of us constituting more than one third of the 25 who joined. It has proved to be a rewarding and helpful experience, but also hard work. Over the first four weeks of the five-week course we were provided with the music and a backing track for four pieces, ranging from 'Basin Street Blues' to 'Blow the Wind Southerly'. After each meeting we were asked to send the tutor recordings of our own part for two of the pieces, all the individual contributions then being compiled to give ensemble playing. The final meeting was a grand "concert" when we played the sixteen pieces which we had learnt on the course. Norwich and the life of Robert Toppes. Our speaker, Richard Matthew, gave a fascinating insight into the story of Robert Toppes who became a member of the mercantile elite and emerged in the 15th century and ran Norwich. His importance has come to light in recent years through the 'discovery' of Dragon Hall, his magnificent trading hall near the river in Norwich. We learnt about his family; his roles as Mayor and MP; his diversifying into property and banking; his political troubles; and the magnificent stained glass window he donated to his parish church. It was an excellent talk which will definitely tempt some of our members to visit Norwich when they can.

We have continued to hold meetings via Zoom over the last year and we have room for one or two more members in the Post Modern & Classical History Group. ## ZOOMING AHEAD

After a year of lockdowns the use of Zoom in our U3A has grown in popularity amongst our members. We have found attendance at some of our meetings now exceeds the 100 participant level allowed in the basic Pro Zoom plan and there is also an increasing demand from Group Organisers to host meetings. The Webteam with EC approval has therefore upgraded to a Zoom Business plan that give us ten licences and the capacity for 300 participants at a meeting without time constraints.

So far we have allocated most of the licences to Group Organisers who host more than one Group meeting and this has reduced the administrative burden on the previous licences, but we do have one spare licence. If you are a Group Organiser managing more than one group, or a member who acts as a Zoom host for a number of meetings, and would like to take advantage of a licence, please let us know.

At some point in the future we hopefully will return to 'face to face' meetings, but Zoom offers us the ability to live stream our talks to a wider audience and this enhancement is currently being explored for the benefit of all our members.
