

## CHAIRMAN'S COLUMN

### Sevenoaks u3a is heading for closure if you don't help!

The papers for the AGM on June 28th are included with this Newsletter. The AGM effectively marks the end of the u3a year and the next Monthly Meeting is in October.

The Trustees' Report makes it very clear that we are in a perilous position. We have over 800 members but far too few are actively involved in the day to day running of our organisation. No-one responded to my appeal for volunteers in the May Newsletter. Unless we have more people willing to come forward to undertake vital roles, **we are at risk of closure** which would mean the end of everything we do, including social events and outings, interest groups and talks.

**The Number of Trustees on the Executive Committee (EC) is the main cause of this risk.** To date we only have nominations for 5 Trustee posts, all current EC members willing to stand for election or re-election. This is the **minimum** number required by the constitution.

To avoid an emergency situation, should any single EC member fall under the proverbial bus, we need 2 more Trustees, one in Communications (some IT skills needed), and the other a Vice Chair Operations (internal members' activities). These posts can be very flexibly designed to suit your skills and interests. Helping can be very rewarding. You meet more people, make new friends, become part of a team with shared goals, and you learn new skills or update existing ones. If you are prepared to consider becoming a Trustee and would like more information or an informal chat please contact me, or one of the other trustees (Beryl Mansell, Helen Wood, David Lowe, David Taylor, Pam Walshe, Sue Christy) soon.

**Supporting Teams.** The news is not all bad. Recently, Pam Walshe has recruited new members for the Social Events team. Sue Christy has recruited a Group Development Team from scratch, and Jenny Ruffles continues to be supported by a full Membership and Recruitment team. Volunteers are however still needed for around 20 roles which would each take no more than 3 or 4 hours a month. ## Science Group Visit to Royal Gunpowder Mills, Waltham Abbey

A group of u3a members visited the Royal Gunpowder Mills to learn about the history of the manufacture of gunpowder and explosives to support the various wars that Britain was engaged in over the centuries. The mills were established in 1688 under private ownership but acquired by the crown in 1787 to enable better control of supply and quality of gunpowder to meet massive increases in demand, which arose over the period of the French Revolution and Napoleonic Wars and it became the largest gunpowder mill in Europe. The wooded site covers 175 acres and has its own network of roads, railways and canals originally used to transport goods around the site and down the River Lea to Woolwich Arsenal. Following the end of the cold war in the 1990's the MoD rationalised much of the defence estate and the Waltham Abbey site closed in 1991. Today it is now a heritage site with listed buildings undergoing restoration. Our visit included a guided tour by road and narrow-gauge railway to various buildings scattered around the site and to buildings that contain artefacts from the past.
